Dear Members. As the 50th year of Felixstowe Travel Watch's operation draws to a somewhat subdued close - it's certainly been no Golden

Jubilee - we're staring down the barrel of further cutbacks in bus services. Whilst peak hour travel has largely returned, off-peak use - often helped by concessionary pass holders - remains stuck at around 50% of pre-Covid levels. Many government subsidy schemes come to a close during October, and we are already hearing of severe cutbacks in some parts of Suffolk - thankfully not in Felixstowe... yet. But there are some brighter things going on. Nearly 1800 copies of FTW's Public Transport timetables have been printed and distributed over the past year - to our own members, at Felixstowe Library and Job Centre, and at the sea front's Tourist Information Beach Hut.

In another piece of good news, I am delighted to welcome - and thank - our member Brenda Jeffery for offering to take on the role of FTW's Hon Secretary on an "acting" basis.

To round off on a positive note, this newsletter has won an award - from Railfuture's Rail User Group. The Traveller won the Silver Award in the Best Newsletter category (See back page). The competition was judged by no less railway luminaries than the likes of Roger Ford (technology editor of Modern Railways), Chris Green (former Chief Exec of Virgin Trains) and Adrian Shooter, the man who founded Chiltern Railways at the start of the railway privatisation era, and later became Chair of Viva Rail, the company converting former London Underground trains for use on the Isle of Wight railway network and elsewhere.

So far this year we have only been successful with one "day out by train" Tour - we went to Ely on 7th July (postponed from June). Tour 2 to the East Anglian Transport Museum was all set to go but was postponed when the "do not travel unless your journey is essential" warnings during the heat wave put a stop to it. 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Tour 3: North Norfolk Railway & Sheringham Thursday 20th October 2022

Sheringham, located in North Norfolk is a delightful Victorian seaside resort with all the attractions you would expect including places to eat and shop. It is the home to the terminus of the North Norfolk Railway line, which runs through to the Georgian town of Holt.

By going in October we will have the "early and late season" railway timetable - see below - which allows plenty of time to visit Sheringham and travel on the railway, before we leave for our homeward journey. The "railway afternoon cream tea" option is sold out for this year.

TIMETABLE FOR THE DAY

Depart Felixstowe 08.54 (Trimley 08.57 or Derby Road 09.07) to arrive Ipswich 09:24 (platform 1) then onto Norwich departing at **09.43** (platform 3) to arrive in Norwich at 10.22 (platform 1)

The final stage - we leave **Norwich at 10.45 (platform 3A)** to arrive in Sheringham at **11.42.**

You can spend all day in Sheringham and/or board a North Norfolk Line train - steam or diesel - to go to Holt and back using the above timetable.

Depart Sheringham (Greater Anglia) station 16.49 to Norwich - arriving at 17.41 (platform 3A) then onto the Great Eastern main line 18.00 train (platform 4) to Ipswich arriving at 18.40 (platform 2) and finally onto the Felixstowe line train 18.58 (platform 3B) to be back at Derby Road by 19.09; Trimley by 19.18 or Felixstowe at 19.24.

Greater Anglia Return Fare: £21.20 (or £13.95 with a Railcard)

Tour 4: Norwich Thursday 17th November 2022

Plenty of things to see and do, including many historic sites, market, shops, plenty of places to eat and drink, arts and culture, riverside walks and gardens. For more information about the Castle renovation project and to buy on-line admission tickets to the restricted areas, go to www.museums.norfolk.gov.uk/norwich-castle.

This will be a simple day-trip taking advantage of the good connections when we change trains at Ipswich, with a relaxing journey time probably quicker than by car.

A map will be provided to plan your way around the City and the short walk to and from the station.

Depart Norwich 16.00 (platform 1) to arrive in Ipswich 16.40 (platform 2) then stand at platform 2B to depart on the 16.58 and arrive at Derby Road by 17.09, Trimley by 17.18 and Felixstowe at 17.24

STAY LONGER? If you leave Norwich for the homeward journey on the 16.00 it allows you five and a half hours to explore, shop and eat. But if you want to stay longer - catch the next train at 17.03 and be back in Felixstowe by 18.24 or even later ones.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All train tours start and finish at Felixstowe railway station, with the advantage of near-by onstreet parking if needed. (The Co-op has not so far charged to use their customer car park). There are also the options of picking up and dropping off at Trimley or Derby Road stations. Your "FTW Tour Guide" will be on hand to be sure that you buy the correct ticket and escort you as we change trains along the routes, with advice on places to go and things to do at our destinations.

BUSES

A Permanent "Temporary Timetable" on the Buses?

This may seem a contradiction in terms, but for the moment at least, the bus service to and from Ipswich is operating to the 25th October 2021 timetable, advertised at the time to be a temporary arrangement. As reported in *The Traveller* #141 (March 2022) this has both its advantages and drawbacks, but the fact remains that in the current situation where bus routes are being withdrawn throughout the country, we are certainly very fortunate to have a service operating at 20 minute intervals during the daytime, with an early evening service until very late - the last bus from Ipswich to Felixstowe leaves at 2315 on weekdays.

We also have a half-hourly service during the main part of the day on Sundays and Bank Holidays - a facility which simply does not exist in many places nowadays. As ever we make an earnest plea to 'use it or lose it' and a cautionary example is to be found towards the west of the county where the route which links Stowmarket with Bury St Edmunds (384) now only operates on school days, resulting in sizeable places such as Woolpit, Elmswell and Thurston with a very restricted service on Mondays to Fridays during term times only. This is a clear demonstration of how a facility can be lost if the public simply do not turn up and use it.

Whilst First operates the Ipswich to Felixstowe route on a commercial basis, the service linking Felixstowe with Woodbridge 73 is supported by Suffolk County Council and the fact that it serves two educational establishments en route at certain times of the day (Felixstowe School and Kesgrave High) does assist in enabling a reasonable level of provision to be made; also permitting an approximately two-hourly facility to serve Old Felixstowe and the Grove Medical Centre. As far as the Woodbridge to Felixstowe section is concerned, this represents an improvement in frequency over that which applied in the 1960s - at least out of the peak summer period. A reason to be very thankful indeed!

A £2 maximum bus fare from January next year

The government has recently announced that single bus fares in England will be capped at a maximum of £2.00 for a three month period from January to March next year - outside of London where normally a cheaper fare applies - in an effort to help passengers cope with the cost of living crisis and encourage those who had ceased to use buses during the early stages

of the pandemic to return. Although many of our members possess free bus passes, these are only valid after 09:30 on weekdays, so this action will assist in particular those who need to travel to early hospital and medical appointments,

TRAINS

Rail performance holds up over the summer months, although the strikes are causing inconvenience

At the risk of 'tempting providence' it is welcome to report that, for the most part, our rail service has achieved high levels of punctuality and reliability during the key summer holiday period, and it was noticeable that the trains were very popular especially when temperatures were soaring - no doubt the air conditioning in the new trains was much appreciated!

More's the pity then, that there have been several days when services did not operate owing to strike action and at the time of writing further action is planned as we go into autumn.

Weekend engineering works set to continue

In what now appears to be an annual ritual, weekend engineering work will be carried out on the Great Eastern mainline on most weekends during this autumn, although there will be some respite over the October half term weekends. This would inevitably involve the tedious and inconvenient bus replacement journeys between Ingatestone and Newbury Park, followed by a change to the Central Line for the subsequent slow haul into Liverpool St.

If this weekend work is necessary next year perhaps the rail company will consider a possible alternative plan once the Elizabeth Line (Crossrail) commences through running from Shenfield through central London and beyond. This alternative would be to operate the replacement buses into Stratford Bus Station, very close to the Elizabeth Line station, from where a speedy onward journey will be available.

This would cut out the transfer to Newbury Park and enable the journey to be made on the new Elizabeth Line trains rather than on the elderly Central Line stock. Just a thought.

Central core of the Elizabeth Line is now open!

A major improvement for passengers travelling onwards from Liverpool St. occurred at the end of May, when the central section of the Elizabeth Line opened. This has transformed the formerly tedious slog on the Circle/Hammersmith & City Underground from Liverpool St. to Paddington into a smooth 10-minute ride on one of the new trains.

It also connects Liverpool St. with destinations south of the Thames, as trains now travel to Abbey Wood where frequent connections to Kentish destinations can easily be made. It's just a 15-minute ride from Liverpool St. to Abbey Wood!


Public Transport Notes (cont'd)

AbelliOUT, Transport UK IN

It was recently announced the Dutch state-owned railway company has agreed to exit the UK transport market which will allow a new company, Transport UK Group, to takeover Abellio's UK services including Greater Anglia. The necessary formalities to complete this buyout will probably take until the end of this year, resulting in Greater Anglia being in majority UK ownership, under the leadership of a management team with extensive local rail industry experience.

This certainly sounds encouraging and hopefully the team will continue to build on the improvements which have been achieved in recent years including the replacement of the entire train fleet with new rolling stock. We look forward to the future with great interest.
