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## Chairman's Editorial

Dear Members. So... into 2022, and Covid is still with us - and still upsetting the patterns of public transport, not to mention our need

or desire to use it. Not exactly the best way to usher in the 50th year of Felixstowe Travel Watch's [and its predecessor in title - East Suffolk Travellers' Association (Felixstowe)] operation.

Over that period, we have seen both today's Committee Members and many of our predecessors - like Charles Taylor, Ken Tricker, John Woollan and Peter Mellor - fight hard for Public Transport in Felixstowe. It all started with the (post Beeching) threat to withdraw our passenger rail service in 1972 - when the town was served by around 8 departures a day on what were already becoming elderly diesel multiple units. Fast forward 50 years, and we now have 18 departures Monday-Friday - hourly throughout most of the day - on some of the most modern rolling stock on the UK railway system.

Later, the then Association's attentions turned to the bus service. We have sadly lost some of the "around town" and summer open-top services of the 1970s. But we were - until the coming of Covid - still blessed with 4 buses an hour during the day between Felixstowe and Ipswich. These also serve Western Felixstowe (75 & X7) and the Landguard peninsular (77), with Old Felixstowe being catered for with a rather cut-down service to Martlesham and Woodbridge. Other than the county town itself, Felixstowe remains one of the best connected towns in Suffolk with its bus service, despite the fact that bus ridership in general has significantly decreased over the last decade.

The third arm of FTW's operations is of course our popular annual tours programme. Still running with 10 or 11 outings per year up until Covid struck, our tours produced the bedrock of our membership and fund raising over the years. Alongside our customary coach outings, in the early days we were even able to justify hiring a train for our outings. As recently as our 30th birthday, we managed to fill a 3-coach Class 170 train for a round trip of East Anglia provided for us by the then Anglia Railways. And for many years, we participated in one of NENTA Train Tours each year.

In more recent times, running special trains has become increasingly difficult, with the amount of work carried out at weekends by Network Rail, and operation of charter trains becoming the sole responsibility of specialist companies, as opposed to the regional franchisees such as Greater Anglia.

Covid sadly saw off our tours programme for both 2020 and most of 2021, (and indeed has put the operations of the likes of NENTA Train Tours into abeyance). But we have put together a series of outings by train for 2022. We sincerely hope you will enjoy participating in these.

Coming up to date, the 3.8% fare increase of 1st March has come as a bit of a shock to the system - although of course it pales to insignificance when compared to the 30p per litre rise (20%) in the cost of diesel at the pumps we've witnessed since the beginning of the war in Ukraine. We've updated our typical fares table and we reproduce it in this edition of The Traveller.

Also in this edition, there's a strong plea for all our members on our books since early 2020 to renew their memberships and confirm their contact details for GDPR purposes. Although our tours may have been curtailed by the pandemic, other aspects of our work certainly haven't been, including the issue of our very popular local bus & train timetables; and our successful Facebook and Tourist Information campaigns to publicise them.

Finally, may I apologise for the lateness of this edition of The Traveller? This has been caused by uncertainty as to when we would be able to restart meetings and a tours programme; the uncertainty around both bus and train timetables and also personal circumstances.

## **Public Transport Notes**

### **BUSES**

With the incidence of COVID-19 in welcome - if slow - retreat, hopefully

the situation on our buses is set to improve soon, with fewer of the bus company's staff being afflicted by the virus, allowing more to return to work, which should result in a more reliable level of service. First Eastern Counties has been experiencing a shortage of drivers, not only due to COVID but also because of an exodus to the road haulage companies, who have been offering higher pay rates as that industry has also suffered from a lack of drivers.

As a result, a small number of journeys are subject to cancellation at short notice and unfortunately these occur particularly in the mid-afternoon services from Felixstowe from 14:40 onwards, when the frequency is reduced from every 20 minutes to half hourly. At this time of day several buses are needed to operate school contracts, and understandably these journeys are given priority, which leads to lengthy waits for those wishing to return home - a far from pleasant experience at this time of year.

The temporary timetable At the time of writing, First is operating a temporary timetable, which has reduced the X7 express to just one journey each way at peak hours on Mondays to Fridays, with the 'on the hour' X7 slot from Ipswich being taken up by a service 75 journey, thus enabling a 20 minute frequency to be sustained for a good proportion of the day.

This maintains the service of two buses per hour around Grange Farm, but due to the slower running time of the 75 versus the X7, the interval around Grange Farm is 20/40 minutes, rather than even half hourly. However, the timetable is structured so that from Great Eastern Square towards Ipswich, the interval is every 20 minutes at the same times past the hour as before, at least until mid-afternoon. As a result, the 77 has reverted to an hourly frequency with departures at 40 minutes past the hour from Ipswich returning at 43 minutes past the hour from the Landguard Visitor Centre.

There are no changes to the Sunday service.

Please be aware that this temporary timetable is subject to alteration at short notice.

**Service 73 gains a new bus stop** There were no changes to this service when First introduced their temporary timetables last October but due to the

changed route omitting Mill Lane and operating via Orwell Road, there was a lengthy distance without a bus stop from near Devon Rd to Orwell Road. Following our representations to Suffolk County Council, this has now been remedied by placing an additional stop on Garrison Lane near Newry Ave and the development on the former Deben High School site.

Government support for bus services extended Fortunately at the last moment the government agreed to extend funding to support for buses (and light rail) by a further £150 million until October, which will certainly assist in avoiding the withdrawal of up to 30% of services, at least for the time being. However this is likely to be the last such package and the incentive will be on promoting increased usage of buses in order to reduce or even avoid the need for future cutbacks in services.

**Bus Back Better** The next stage of the process is the creation of an Enhanced Bus Partnership by April this year, and we understand that work is in progress at Suffolk County Council to establish this organisation. Much needed improvements to services will of course require funding, so the proof of the pudding...

**Fare increases** As might have been expected First introduced some fare increases earlier this year but have revived promotion of the Felixstowe Town Zone ticket, which had been introduced at £4.30 for a day's unlimited travel within Felixstowe and the Trimleys. The Town Zone ticket is also available at discounted rates for longer periods.

#### RAIL

Performance on our line remains very good - and what a pleasure it is to say this, in marked contrast to the dire situation which prevailed over so many years of Felixstowe Travel Watch's existence. The advent of Greater Anglia's fleet of brand new trains (and plenty of them), together with the creation of the dual track Trimley loop in 2019, have made a major impact on punctuality and reliability.

With the restoration of two trains per hour between London and Norwich good connections have been restored from our line to both these important destinations.

The Cambridge Conundrum Whilst this welcome restoration enables rail journey times from Felixstowe to both London and Norwich to be made which are very competitive with journeys by road, this cannot be claimed in relation to Cambridge, where rail travel to this most popular destination is a very lengthy process involving a wait of nearly an hour at Ipswich on the return journey.

## Public Transport Notes (cont'd)

An improvement to the situation is unlikely without a recasting of the timetable, so is there a practical alternative to the A14? - a road on which unpredictable delays can often occur.

We suggest two possibilities. If returning from Cambridge in the afternoon on the 15:46 (which arrives in Ipswich at 17:01), by crossing the road to the bus stop adjacent to the Station Hotel you can catch the X7 express bus at around 17:16, enabling an arrival at Great Eastern Square at 17:46 - some 40 minutes before the train, and avoiding the lengthy wait on Ipswich station. At present, the above is the only X7 journey from Ipswich and it only operates on Mondays to Fridays.

The other alternative is to use one of the frequent trains from Cambridge to Ely, returning to Ipswich on the two hourly service from Peterborough, which reduces the wait at Ipswich to around half an hour. Some research on the timetable is needed for this to work! It does make for a more interesting journey, but please allow sufficient time at Ely to make a comfortable connection into the Ipswich train. There is an additional fare for using this route.

'Great British Railways' on the horizon The major rewrite of the Greater Anglia timetable set for December 2021 did not happen and the rail industry is currently in a state of limbo until more details emerge about the 'Great British Railways' organisation, which is likely to determine the shape of the rail industry for many years to come. Watch this space!
